Security Update

We've received reports of a recent robbery in our community. While we haven't been officially notified, we want to remind everyone to be vigilant and report any suspicious activity to the HOA office immediately. Rumors can spread misinformation, so please rely on official sources for information.

Charging Station Progress

We're excited to share that the design plans for our new charging stations have been completed by SCE. We anticipate approval by the end of the week and will be reviewed by NHSB and **PLEMCo**. We'll keep you updated on the installation timeline.

Recycling Clarifications

There's been some confusion about recycling in our community. Here's a breakdown:

- Black Bins: These bins are for CRV Plastic and aluminum cans. They are collected by the Conservation Club, and the funds are used for community projects.
- Blue Bins: These bins are for clean recyclables like cardboard, office paper, miscellaneous plastic containers (not CRV), plastic film, metal, and glass (including wine, beer, and pop bottles). They are collected by Universal Waste Systems. Please note that we do not receive reimbursement for this recycling, but we are required to separate clean waste from regular waste.
- Green Bins: These bins are for organic waste like grass clippings, weeds, and plants. They are collected by Universal Waste Systems.

My Sunday Salon


We reveled in a rousing discussion of Shakespeare at My Sunday Salon on September 15th.
