The new HOA fee starting in January 2025 will be \$532.00, a 7.69% increase. This increase is primarily due to the substantial increase in our insurance. 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# **Zinsco Panel Replacement Project Deadline December 31, 2024**



We are writing to inform you of an urgent matter requiring immediate attention: replacing outdated **Zinsco electrical panels** in our community.

#### Why is this necessary?

- **Insurance Risk:** Our current insurer, **Farmers Insurance,** has notified us that they will not renew our policy due to the size of our community. They are no longer insuring large Condo Complexes.
- **Increased Insurance Costs:** Any new insurer will likely charge significantly higher premiums, potentially up to **300%** more, due to the known fire hazards of **Zinsco** panels.

To mitigate these risks and secure affordable insurance coverage for our community, residents must replace all **Zinsco** panels. This has led to significant challenges for owners with Zinsco panels, however, this must be done by **December 31**<sup>st</sup> by all owners to potentially lessen the HOA insurance fee.

We understand that this is unexpected, but it is a critical step to protect the value of your homes and the overall safety of our community. Contact the office for a list of vetted electricians. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

#### **Short History of Zinsco Panels**

**Zinsco** electric panels, popular in the 1960s & 70s, were later found to have significant design flaws. These panels were prone to overheating and failing to trip when overloaded, increasing the risk of electrical fires. While not formally recalled by the manufacturer, insurance companies and electrical experts widely recognized the danger and began advising homeowners to replace them. This has led to significant challenges for homeowners with **Zinsco** panels. Each member is responsible for the cost of changing their panels, and, if any member needs an electrical contractor, please call the office for a list of the recommended electricians in the area.

#### **Important Notice: 2025 HOA Fee Increase**

We understand fee increases are never welcome news, but we want to be transparent about the reasons for the **\$38.00** increase in your HOA fees.

Recent economic factors, including significant inflation and a dramatic rise in insurance premiums (as much as **300%** or more), have placed a substantial financial burden on our HOA. These rising costs are essential to maintain our community's safety, security, and overall value.

We are committed to using these funds responsibly to address these increased expenses and continue to provide the high-quality services and amenities you expect. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.
