While we strive to keep costs manageable, it's important to note that these types of projects can require significant investments. To ensure we address these needs effectively, the Board adjusts the annual fees over time.

- Communicate: If you have concerns or questions, don't hesitate to reach out to the Board

The Board reviewed the action tracker, with pending projects.

REPORTS

- **President's Report:** Gail Standley briefly updated the charging stations. **Plemco** purchased a new panel due to a design change. Trash bin's locations and purpose of use were explained.
- **Orientation:** Joannie Jones orientated 3 new owners, 1 renter, co-owner, and 1 tenant.
- Roofs and Gutters: Gary informed the residents that building 312 roof is in progress. Gutter replacement or installation for buildings 312,402,611,623 are being scheduled.
- Golf Enhancement Project: Tom Kasterko reported that the golf course is closed for the next few weeks for aeration and re-seed. It will re-open on Monday, September 30th.
- Paving Project: George Bunce informed the membership that paving has been scheduled for Thursday, September 26th- Friday, October 4th.
- 2025 Board of Directors Election George Bunce announced that on October 11th early nominations for candidate's applications will be opening to run for the Board of Directors.

General Manager Notes

As we approach the end of the year, let's look back at all the accomplishments that will continue preserving this beautiful community. Thank you, Board, for being proactive! I wish everyone a Happy Thanksgiving

- As of November 2024, 10 roofs have been replaced, leaving only 14 more to go. Once all buildings are completed, we will begin on the garages.
- 24 gutters have been replaced, year-to-date.
- The community was inspected for tripping hazards. The proposal is being reviewed and the work will be scheduled.
- We are scheduling the next round of tree trimming for the winter.
- Access 1 garage driveway was paved and looks great.
- Storm drains are being inspected and hydro-jetted before the rainy season.
- Garages' C, both sides, and VV, one side, were fumigated. All other garages are being inspected, per requests, and treated accordingly.
- Thanks to the landscape chair, Barabara Marriott, we are beautifying several bare areas and adding more water-resistant plants throughout the community.
- 12 decks/balconies were completed. More are on schedule to be inspected and repaired on a worse condition basis.
- Lastly, the coffee and chat will be on hold during November and December. They will resume on January 28, 2025.







The Rainbow Collection **Kiwanis Buddy Bench Program**

Hello, Residents of New Horizons!!!! And congratulations! Your generous plastic bottle cap contributions are going to make some local children very happy.

Here's a refresher: Our local Redondo Beach Kiwanis Club collects plastic bottle caps to make sturdy, plastic park benches. The "**Buddy Benches**" come in many colors - including rainbow - and are placed at schools throughout California. When a child feels bad or can't find friends to play with, they sit on the bench to signal other kids. Very quickly, classmates see the child and invite them to play.

"It really works. The kids don't sit alone very long", says Jon Gran, Past President of Redondo Beach Kiwanis, and Buddy Bench Project leader. "It gives the children a chance to see beyond themselves. Being a friend through the Buddy Bench gets them out of their normal routine. It's a really powerful gesture."

And New Horizons is helping that happen. So far, we've donated more than 200 pounds of bottle caps, which is enough for one bench. That bench will likely be dedicated this month at Hermosa Valley School.

The benches from our local Kiwanis have benefited schools from Northern California to Oceanside. And Gran says it's an easy




