Below are a few facts for Association living:

Below are a few reminders:

- Power washing of Areas 5 and 6 trash enclosures was completed. Next is Area 4.
- Golf course palm trees were trimmed.
- Avoid a fine. Clean up your garage.
- Do not remove any plants, or mulch added to your area by the landscape committee, if you have questions, contact the office.
- No feeding of squirrels, cats, wild animals, etc.
- Register all vehicles and pets with the office.
- No plugging of any electric vehicles or electric bicycles in common areas or garages.
- Keep your attics, decks, balconies, and patios clean to avoid rodents. Do not leave standing water to avoid mosquitos.
- A keycard is required to access our facilities. Do not lend yours out or give access to someone without a key card. Let's keep our facilities safe.










Why did your homeowner's insurance go up?

Many of our residents are noting unusually high increases in their homeowner's insurance. The newspapers report aggressive price increases sought by insurance companies throughout California. Significant rate hikes are sought, as much as 40%. Around a month before homeowners insurance renewal, your insurer will notify you of any changes to your coverage or rates for the coming year. For homeowners whose premiums went up, the average increase was \$244 per year.


